Graduates - STUDENT LOAN EXIT COUNSELING

The U.S. Department of Education requires that students complete Direct Loan Exit Counseling before graduation.

Sign in to the www.StudentLoans.gov Web site (You will need your Federal Student Aid PIN.)

- Select the Complete Counseling link under the Counseling section of the left navigation pane.
- Select the Start button within the Exit Counseling section of the page. Select Your Schools to Notify (**UTHSC should be already populated at the top**). If not, click the "Add School" button. Once you do this, the School Name and Address appear with a check box next to it. If you do not click the "Add School" button then this school will not be notified.
- Select the Continue button at the bottom of the page to proceed to the next step of the counseling session.
- **This is NOT required if the student does not have Federal Direct Student Loans!!!**

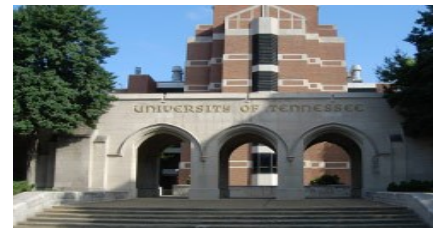

The One Stop Shop

The One Stop Shop is **your first stop - and possibly your only stop** - for frequently asked questions or problems you may have regarding financial aid, registration, admissions, student life, or student accounts.

Transcript requests are processed at the One Stop Shop. Transcripts can be ordered by current students, alumni, and former students of the University.

Transcript requests are generally processed and mailed within 3-5 business days (5-7 during peak times).

- Mail – Paper transcripts are mailed using standard delivery through the U.S. Postal Service. You may opt for express shipping at your own cost. Students must provide a pre-paid envelope with the recipient's name and address to the Registrar's Office.
- Pickup – Transcripts can be held for pick up at the Registrar's Office. Students must provide a photo ID before the transcript is release.

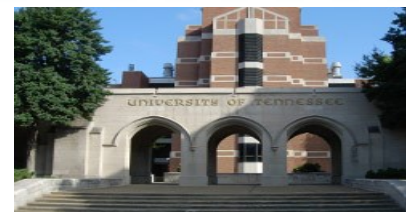

[Express Scripts Scholars Program](#) - AACP is working with Express Scripts to facilitate the application process for the new Express Scripts Scholars Program. As an organization, Express Scripts recognizes that students interested in dual degrees may have increased financial need and supports the efforts of academic pharmacy to educate students with diverse interests. The Express Scripts Scholars Program will provide **four (4) \$10,000 scholarships** to enrolled dual degree students each year. The awarded students are given \$2,500 per semester for 4 consecutive semesters, totaling \$10,000 over 2 years. **Application Deadline: August 31, 2015 at 5:00 p.m. EST.** Questions? Dr. Herbert W. Nickens was the founding vice president of the AAMC's Diversity Policy and Programs unit (formerly Division of Community and Minority Programs). His passionate leadership contributed greatly to focusing national attention on the need to support underrepresented minorities in medicine. He believed that a multidisciplinary approach is needed to address inequities in health. As a result, nominees may come from a wide range of fields, including medicine, dentistry, education, law, nursing, pharmacy, public health, and social and behavioral sciences. The award is given to an individual who has made outstanding contributions to promoting justice in medical education and health care equity in the United States. The recipient receives a \$10,000 award and presents the Nickens Lecture at the Learn Serve Lead: The AAMC Annual Meeting. The nomination process will open January 4, 2016. The deadline to email your nomination packet is May 6, 2016.
