National Health Service Corps Students to Service Loan Repayment Program

The NHSC Students to Service (S2S) Program provides up to \$120,000 to medical students (MD and DO) in their final year of school in return for a three year service commitment to practice medicine in a community with limited access to care. And with your continued NHSC service, all of your remaining educational debt can be paid off.

Under the National Health Service Corps (NHSC) Students to Service Loan Repayment Program (S2S LRP), medical students (MD or DO) in their final year of school are eligible to receive loan repayment assistance in return for working in underserved rural and urban communities throughout the country, known as Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSAs), of greatest need.

2015 Pisacano Scholars Leadership program

The Pisacano Leadership Foundation is pleased to announce that the application for the 2015 Pisacano Scholars Leadership program is now available online at www.pisacano.org. The Pisacano Scholars Leadership program is designed to provide educational programs, leadership training, and funding **to reimburse a portion of medical-school-related debt**. Scholarships will be awarded to outstanding medical students for a four-year period. Students who have made a commitment to the field of family medicine and who will **enter their fourth year in medical school in the fall of 2015** may apply. The PLF will award scholarships with a maximum value of \$28,000 each for the 2015-2016 academic year. Please remind students that the applications must be **received by March 2, 2015** to be considered.

The National Institutes of Health (NIH) Medical Research Scholars Program (MRSP; <http://www.cc.nih.gov/training/mrsp/index.html>)

is a year-long research enrichment program designed to attract creative, research-oriented medical, dental, and veterinary students to the NIH intramural campus in Bethesda, MD. The MRSP is designed for rising fourth-year students (initial clinical rotations completed), but does not exclude other students with strong research interests from applying. Students engage in a mentored basic, clinical, or translational research project that matches their professional interests and research and career goals. The MRSP also provides an academic curriculum with content highlighting the process of scientific discovery, training in clinical protocol development and human subjects research, clinical teaching rounds utilizing the robust pool of patients enrolled in research protocols at the NIH Clinical Center, and academic leadership training. Applications for the 2015-2016 MRSP class are being accepted from October 1, 2014 – January 15, 2015 (Eligible students can apply at: <http://www.cc.nih.gov/training/mrsp/application.html>). Accepted students would start the program in the summer of 2015.

Predoctoral Dental Student Scholarships and Underrepresented Minority Dental Student Scholarships

Application deadline: Nov. 14

[ADAF Dental Student Scholarship Application and Guidelines](#) The ADAF's Predoctoral Dental Student Scholarship Program, including the Underrepresented Minority Dental Student Scholarships, the Dr. Robert B. Dewhirst Scholarships and the Robert J. Sullivan Scholarships, helps predoctoral dental students defray some of their academic expenses. The Foundation awards about 54 scholarships of up to \$2,500 each, totaling up to about \$135,000 annually. Students must be enrolled full-time in the second year of study at an accredited dental school while maintaining a minimum 3.25 grade point average. **New for 2014:** The minimum GPA is now 3.25/4.0 (previously 3.5/4.0). Also, the ADAF encourages up to five applications per school for the Underrepresented Minority Dental Student Scholarships (still one application per school for the general scholarships).

E. "Bud" Tarrson Dental School Student Community Leadership Award

Application deadline: Nov. 14

[ADAF Tarrson Award Application and Guidelines](#) The ADAF Tarrson Award recognizes exemplary volunteer community service projects that are organized and/or conducted by a group of dental students enrolled in an accredited predoctoral dental education program. The ADA Foundation accepts one application from each accredited dental school with a predoctoral dental student group involved in an outreach program to vulnerable communities within the U.S. **New for 2014:** Programs that have won a Tarrson Award in the last three calendar years were previously prohibited from applying, but now may re-apply. A dental school's prior Tarrson Awards may be a factor considered by the Committee in selecting awardees.

Dr. Thomas J. Zwemer Award

Application deadline: Nov. 14

[ADAF Zwemer Award Application and Guidelines](#) The Dr. Thomas J. Zwemer Award recognizes and encourages student programs that provide services to underserved populations outside of the U.S. One grant of \$5,000 is made annually to a dental school in honor of the selected student outreach program. Dental student groups at accredited dental schools who are involved in an outreach program to vulnerable communities outside of the U.S. are eligible to apply. The ADA Foundation accepts one application from each dental school.

Dr. Ray Bowen Student Research Award

Application deadline: Dec. 5

[Dr. Ray Bowen Student Research Award Application and Guidelines](#) The ADA Foundation, in collaboration with the Academy of Operative Dentistry, offers the Dr. Ray Bowen Student Research Award in odd-numbered years. Formerly known as the Paffenbarger Award, the Dr. Ray Bowen Award is open to dental students at all levels who wish to undertake novel research relevant to contemporary operative dentistry. The award is valued at \$6,000, with additional support up to \$1,000 provided for the student's presentation of their research at an AOD conference.
