The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act ("CARES Act") of 2020 and The American Rescue Plan (ARP) of 2021 require the university to provide timely reporting of compliance with the distribution of the Higher Education Relief Fund ("HEERF III") to provide emergency financial aid grants to students for expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to the coronavirus.

- The University of Tennessee Health Science Center acknowledges that the institution signed and returned to the U.S. Department of Education the Certification and Agreement and the institution intends to use no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 314(a)(1) of ARP to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.
- The total amount of funds that the institution will receive from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students is \$1,256,350.
- The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 314(a)(1) of the ARP as of September 30, 2021 is \$1,256,350, which reflects the entire student portion of the grant.
- The University estimates 3,237 students in the 2021-22 academic year are eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section (a)(1) of the ARP.
- As of September 30, 2021, 1,227 students in the 2021-22 academic year have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section (a)(1) of the ARP.
- The University awarded the grants to students prioritizing those with the highest need all in the Fall semester of the 2021-22 academic year.
 - Students submitted an application defining educational expenses for which grant funds were requested due to the disruption, and were awarded in accordance with the application submitted, in order of need (Pell Grant recipients had priority), application submission date and fund availability.
- Instructions, directions, and guidance were provided by the institution to students concerning the emergency financial aid grants. The following email was sent to all 3,237 students identified for the 2021-2022 academic year on August 3, 2021:

UTHSC has received HEERF III funding and will be distributing grants ranging from \$250 to \$1,500 to eligible students enrolled in the Fall 2021 term. 


