

## ICD-10-CM/PCS Training for non-coders

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The objective of this continuing education program is to meet the CEU requirement from CCHIIM for maintenance of the RHIT and RHIA credentials. Others interested in learning baseline information about the new ICD-10-CM/PCS coding systems are the impact of these changes on healthcare operations, revenue cycle and reimbursement may also benefit from this training.

Providers are required to utilize ICD-10 codes by October 1, 2013.

CCHIIM requires that all certified RHITs and RHIAs complete six CEUS in ICD-10-CM/PCS.

### Training modules

- \* Introduction to ICD-10-CM basics (1 CEU)
- \* Introduction to ICD-10 PCS (2 CEUs)
- \* Business impact and implementation considerations for ICD-10 CM/PCS (2 CEUs)
- \* Impact on Reimbursement (1 CEU)

The modules are designed to provide awareness of ICD-10-CM/PCS including the general structure of the systems, potential impact to workflow process in order to prepare for the system. The modules also address the use of ICD-10-CM/PCS including the analysis, trending or providing information that involved coded data.

### On-line training
