Many months were spent preparing for the NIH Data Sharing Policy to go into effect. It became official on January 25th. **Learn** more on pages 13-14.




APRIL - TAMARA GOES NATIONAL

The Campbell Collaboration's open course "Systematic Review and Meta-Analysis-Open & Free" is used as the course material. Eight library faculty and staff participated in the course.



UARTER RENCES

The final quarter of the 2022-2023 academic year was filled with conferences. In June, eight Librarians traveled to Detriot for the 2023 Medical Library Association (MLA) Conference, presenting nine times on topics across the library spectrum. In May they went to the University of Memphis Law Library for the West Tennessee Academic Library Consortium conference where Sarah Thompson and Jenessa McElfresh presented on the UTHSC Library News video series.







HISTORICAL COLLECTION

The Health Science Historical Collections continued its trend of growth for the 2022-2023 year. Research requests increased by 5% from the previous year. The HSHC continued to have a presence at numerous alumni events. New accessions included photos from the UTHSC chapter of the Phi Delta Chi pharmacy fraternity, memorabilia from the St. Joseph Hospital School of Nursing, and materials from the UTHSC College of Health Professions.

The HSHC began a new initiative to increase representation of UTHSC's African American alumni community in the campus archives to ensure that we accurately represent the diversity of our campus and that our institutional memory includes underrepresented voices. Working with Alumni Affairs, HSHC Archivist Jennifer Langford and Research and Learning Services Senior Librarian Tamara Nelson solicited donations from African American College of Medicine alumni. The HSHC also had a presence at the April 2023 CoM African American alumni reunion banquet to network with alumni about the project.

The year's biggest HSHC project was co-curating a permanent exhibit on the life and work of nursing theorist Dr. Margaret A. Newman with Director of the new Dr. Margaret A. Newman Center for Nursing Theory, Dr. Marie Gill. The exhibit was installed for the grand opening of the center on May 30. An in-depth collection was also curated for attendees of the Newman Center's scholarly dialogues held as part of the opening event on May 31. Collaboration between the HSHC and the Newman Center is ongoing, with a forthcoming digital collection and exhibits in progress.

REQUESTS

Finally, the HSHC went viral thanks to a social media collaboration with HSL Communications Coordinator, Sarah Thompson! Sarah had the idea to adapt the "trinket box" video trend using objects from the archives. The resulting videos had over a million views, and Sarah won a Gold Award from the Public Relations Society of America.

DIGITAL COMMONS

Digital Commons is the UTHSC Institutional Repository. Managed by the Library, it disseminates UTHSC scholarship and research to a global audience. One of the biggest users of our institutional repository is the College of Nursing's Doctor of Nursing Practice Program. As part of their program, students must complete an evidence-based practice project. Once completed, this project is deposited in the repository where it's easy for students to collect research metrics, add to their circulum vitae, and share with potential employers. Dr. Bobby B. Bellflower, DNSc, NNP-BC, FAANP, DNP Program Director said, "It makes a big difference for a nurse practitioner or nurse midwife or CRNA to be able to have a presentation on their CV and be able

to show that presentation at a moments notice." Carrie Harvey, PhD, APRN-BC, ACNP-BC, CHFN, continued saying, "it also has a benefit for faculty. Faculty can be part of that project as authorship."

NEW NEW SERVICES

The National Institutes of Health announced their Data Management and Sharing Policy which went into effect for new grant applications beginning January 25, 2023.

Conversations had been happening for a number of years about the open sharing of data, which is why the UTHSC Library hired Jess Newman to be Research Data and Scholarly Communications Lead in 2018. When the news came out about the mandate, the Library knew its patrons would need more assistance with research data which led to bringing Sarah Newell on board as a Research Data and Assessment Librarian.

With the team assembled and the data policy announced, a series of interviews were done with researchers on campus to explore what services the library would need to develop to serve them after January 2023.

The new data dynamic duo did several presentations across campus including the campus wide presentation. Dozens of researches in the right phase of their research cycle. There have also been hundreds of views on the newly rennovated data libguide since its publication.
