INTRODUCTION & TARGET AUDIENCE

The Tennessee Board of Pharmacy requires that one-half (15 hours) of the required 30 hours of continuing education every two years, must be live. The 2010 "Pharmacy Update" will provide a 2 day total of 15 "live" hours. You may choose to register for either day alone, providing 8 live-hours of CE for the *Drug Update* or 7 live-hours of CE for the *General & Legal Update*.

The 33rd Annual "Pharmacy Update" is intended to provide the opportunity for pharmacists and pharmacy technicians to be informed of recent changes, present challenges and future opportunities affecting drug therapy and pharmacy practice.
