PROGRAM DESCRIPTION AND TARGET AUDIENCE

The Tennessee Board of Pharmacy requires that one-half (15 hours) of the required 30 hours of continuing education every two years must be live. The 2012 “*Pharmacy Update*” will provide a 2-day total of 15 “live” contact hours. You may also choose to register for either day alone, providing 8 live contact hours of CE for the *Drug Update* or 7 live contact hours of CE for the *General & Legal Update*.

The 35th Annual “*Pharmacy Update*” is intended to provide the opportunity for pharmacists and pharmacy technicians to be informed of recent changes, present challenges and future opportunities affecting drug therapy and pharmacy practice.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

The overall goal of this knowledge-based CPE activity is to update the participant to changes and advances made during 2011 that have affected pharmacy practice and to look at what is happening in 2012.

Upon completion of 0064-0000-12-002-L01-P (Drug Update) the participant should be able to:

- Formulate a process to adequately inform patients and prescribers of the pharmacological and therapeutic application(s) of drugs introduced in 2011.
- Identify essential information to counsel patients on changes in the therapeutic application(s) of existing drugs and alternative therapies.

Upon completion of 0064-0000-12-003-L03-P (Law) the participant should be able to:

- Comply with the regulations of the Tennessee Board of Pharmacy.
- Describe and comply with legal changes affecting business and professional practice.

Upon completion of 0064-0000-12-004-L04-P (General) the participant should be able to:

- Analyze legislative changes nationally and in the state of Tennessee that affected pharmacy during 2011, and describe the pros and cons of proposed legislation for 2012.
- Describe the current issues related to prescription drug abuse and diversion and their impact on public policy issues and pharmacy practice.
- Utilize the Tennessee Controlled Substances Database and analyze data from the database.

CONTINUING EDUCATION (ACPE) CREDIT

The University of Tennessee College of Pharmacy is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education as a provider of continuing pharmacy education. This knowledge-based program will provide up to 15 live contact CE hours. A statement of credit will be available at the conclusion of the seminar to participants who successfully complete each activity. Successful completion includes attending the entire session, signing the attendance sheet for that session, and completing the self-assessment instrument and program evaluation form for each activity. Beginning 2012 your CE credits will also be submitted electronically to NABP and in 2013 we will no longer be providing paper copies of CE statements.
