## HIGHLIGHTS

### June 17, 2010 Luncheon Meeting

President Harry Mincer called the meeting to order, and then introduced the invited speaker, Dr. Timothy Hottel, Dean of the College of Dentistry, Dr. Hottel gave an informative presentation about progress during his first year as Dean. The College of Dentistry is scheduled for next accreditation on March 30, 2010. The incoming class has a GPA of 3.57 overall and a GPA of 3.51 in science. Changes are noted in these areas: in curriculum, use of paperless charts and digital radiographs, communications, practice management, and dental simulation laboratory. New faculty has been recruited: one each in oral medicine, oral maxiofacial surgery, regular dentistry, periodontics, posthodontics, research, clinical affairs, and psychology, two each in orthodontics, endodontics, and pediatrics. Five additional new faculty members are slated to begin July 1. The College of Dentistry has a national presence as evidenced by work and research in areas that include: cell and tissue engineering, oral cancer, oral biofilm, demineralization and remineralization, erosion, designer biomaterial, and scaffolds for regenerative craniofacial health and drug delivery, health disparities and equality. Plans are for nurse practitioners to work with dentists. The College has interaction involving over twenty other entities. In the past year, funds have been raised from alumni and corporate sponsors. Over four million for the Dunn Building renovations has been raised. Endowed funds contributed over \$500,000, and for other non-specified funds over fourteen million dollars has been raised. The goal is to raise twenty three million dollars to make the Dunn Building brand new. All of this has been accomplished in Dean Hottel's first year at UTHSC.

New members Bernell Rogers and Joyce Bittle were introduced along with four invited guests.

A brief Treasurer's report was read.

Harry Mincer spoke about the UTHSC Retirees Association's cooperation with the University of Memphis Retirees Association to plan joint functions. The next event is a June 24 tour of Elmwood Cemetery organized by board member, Dianne Wyatt.

An election will be held at the September meeting to elect the Vice President/President Elect and one new at-large board member. The meeting adjourned at 1:30 PM.
