To all who come to this Medical Center in Memphis, Tennessee, we dedicate our ASKLEPIEION.



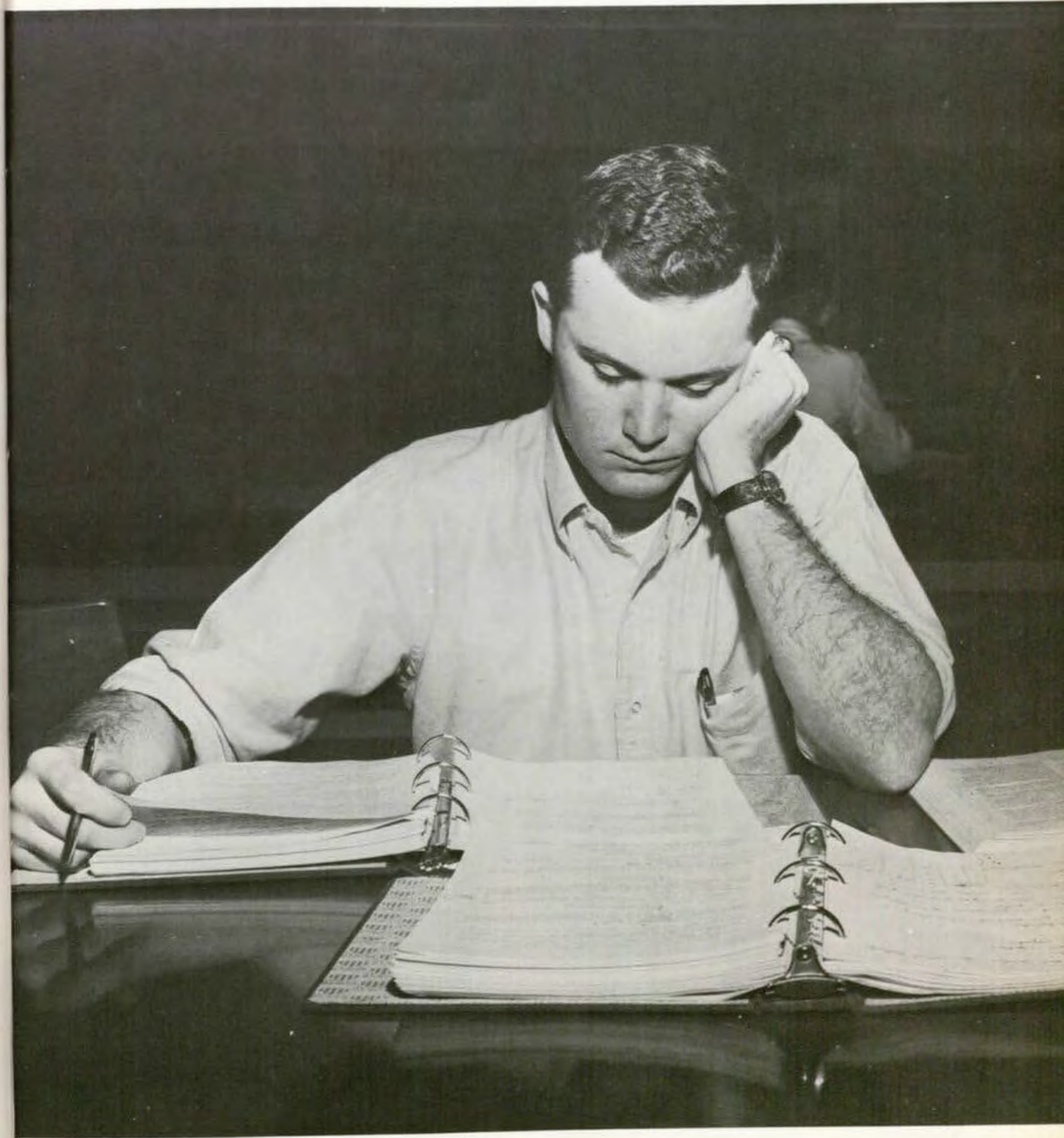
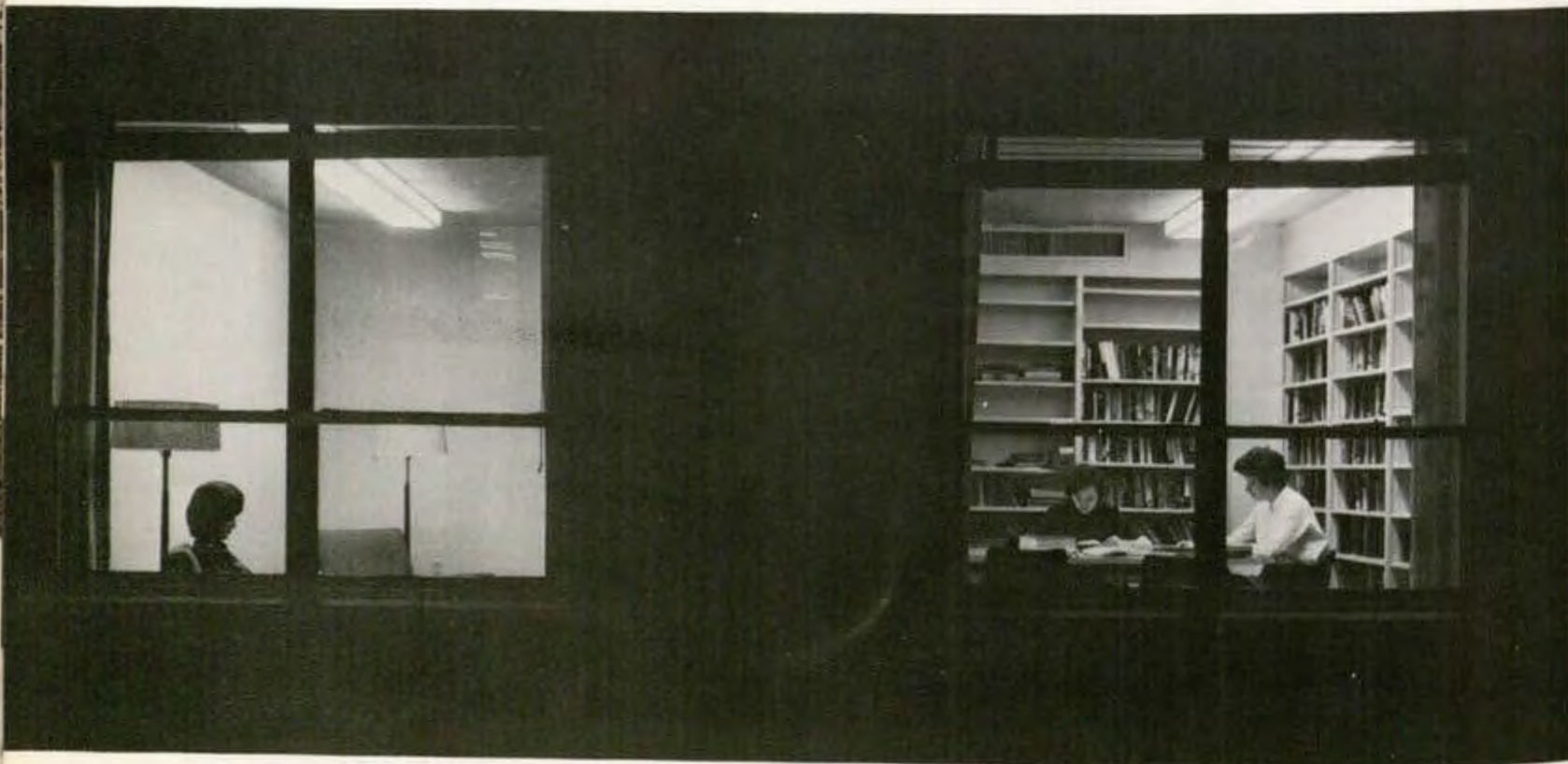

It has been a long-accepted philosophy in our Nation that the level of higher learning to which any citizen may aspire be limited only by the individual's capacity to learn.

You, who are completing your current programs of learning in the various fields of the health professions and allied fields, are fortunate to have had such opportunities. I commend you for having reached your present levels of attainment and wish for each of you success in the realization of whatever goals you have set. At the same time, I implore you to interest yourselves in two areas of greatest importance.

In contrast to the general philosophy expressed above, the ability of institutions to provide the opportunities in higher learning is decidedly limited by financial resources available to them and to the individual.

The time is near when demands on the institutions caused by increased numbers of students will outstrip their capacities to meet them so long as they remain largely dependent on tax revenues and student fees for support. By the same token, the increasing costs of higher education for the individual, particularly in the fields of education for the health professions, can have the effect of limiting these opportunities to young men and women coming from families in the higher income brackets. This, of course, must not be permitted to happen.

As you enter your chosen careers, therefore, I appeal to you to keep the University in mind, and as alumni, to do all possible to support it or any particular part of it. This may be done either by your direct financial contributions or by encouraging patients, friends, or acquaintances to contribute such assistance. Funds are needed and will continue to be needed to maintain the very highest type of institution necessary to guide its students to the highest levels of learning. Funds also are needed and will continue to be needed to assist many students well qualified and worthy to the same goals that you yourself have set.

As you leave this institution, I would encourage you also to keep in mind that you are entering dynamic fields in which change is constantly occurring. The mere fact that you have completed a formal phase of your education cannot be accepted as the completion of your education. The Medical Units particularly is providing more and more opportunities for continuing education in order that the busy professional men and women will have the opportunities for life-long learning. It is my hope that you may be seen frequently on the campus participating in such continuing education programs. These also will need your support, and your participation in them will provide that support.

Again, let me wish you the greatest success in whatever you may undertake.

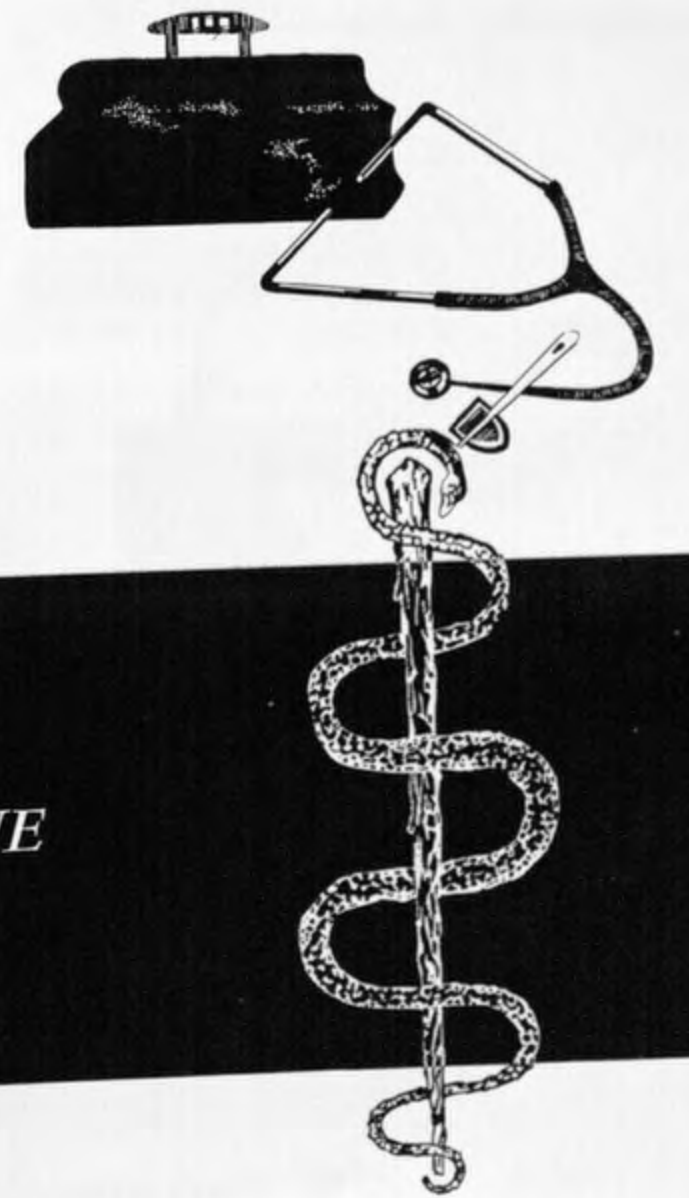

## College of Medicine

The College of Medicine was founded in 1876 in Nashville, transferred to Memphis in 1911, and during the past fifty-three years has grown to become one of the nation's larger medical centers.

The College of Medicine maintains a balanced curriculum with sufficient flexibility to train and graduate students in the medical profession as family doctors, specialists, research fellows, and instructors in medical colleges.

Pre-clinical studies through lectures and laboratory courses in anatomy, bio-chemistry, physiology, microbiology, pharmacology, and pathology provide fundamental knowledge of health and disease.

Clinical years are spent in the continuation and application of study in the out-patient clinics and within the university staffed hospitals and laboratories.

Increasing opportunities are becoming available for those students who are interested in research.

New students entering the college also benefit by a completely new curriculum which has been designed to keep pace with the ever broadening field of modern medicine.

## College of Dentistry

The College of Dentistry of the University of Tennessee was established in Nashville in 1878. In 1911 it moved to Memphis where it absorbed the University of Memphis College of Dental Surgery (founded in 1910). It is the oldest dental college in the South and the third-oldest now in operation in the nation.

The four-quarter system in operation at the University of Tennessee College of Dentistry is unique in that Tennessee has the only dental school operating under the plan of accepting and graduating a class each quarter.

The curriculum is divided into two phases, pre-clinical and clinical work. In the beginning years, the student studies basic medical sciences and courses in dental anatomy. Technique courses are added to the curriculum as the student progresses. During this period he becomes familiar with the various phases of operative dentistry, crown and bridge, and denture prosthetics.

The clinical years are spent applying the knowledge learned in the restoration of the oral cavity. The student develops a working knowledge of all phases of dentistry by working under the supervision of qualified instructors in the various fields, which include surgery, periodontics, pedodontics, diagnosis, operative dentistry, crown and bridge prosthetics, and dentistry for the chronically ill.

## College of Pharmacy

The University of Tennessee College of Pharmacy was founded in 1898 as a part of the University of Tennessee Department of Chemistry in Knoxville. The School of Pharmacy, as it was then known, was moved to Nashville in 1909 and to Memphis in 1911 where it was operated as a separate school in the newly founded Medical Units.

Since then, the College of Pharmacy has become fully accredited and ranks as one of the largest Colleges of Pharmacy in the United States.

Recently, the curriculum has been revised and updated to enable the student to pursue work toward Master of Science and Doctor of Philosophy degrees in the various areas of Pharmaceutical Science. These areas include Pharmaceutics, Pharmacognosy, and Pharmaceutical and Medicinal Chemistry. Also, a program with several Memphis hospitals has greatly strengthened the instruction in Hospital Pharmacy.

The use of the latest scientific equipment, the employment of new techniques, and the instruction of highly selected and trained faculty members has enabled the graduates of the University of Tennessee College of Pharmacy to become a credit to their profession.

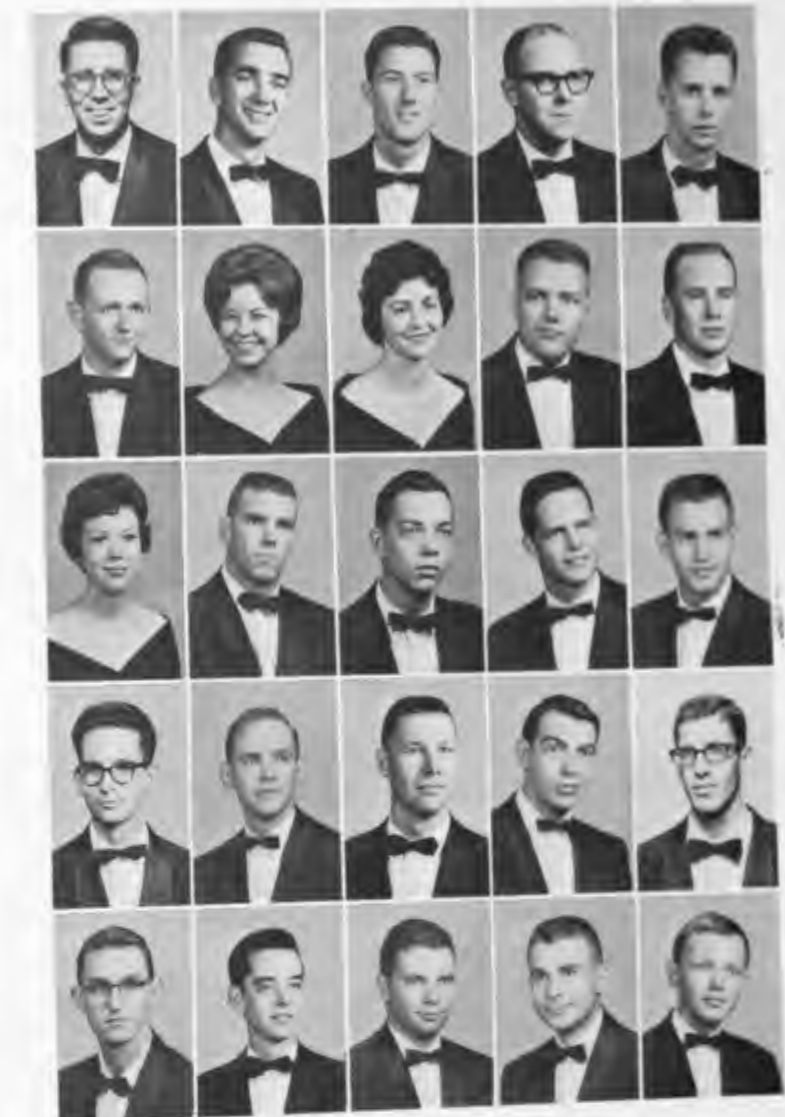

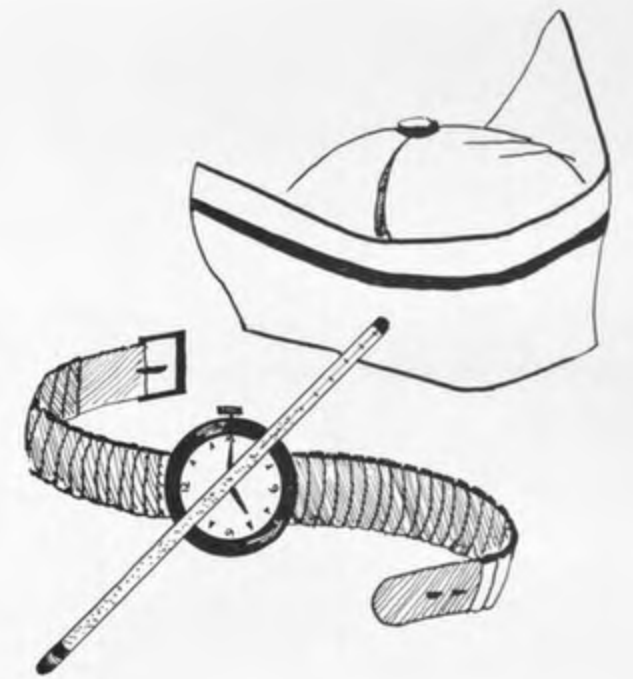

## College of Nursing

In 1898 the Training School of the Memphis General Hospital was established. By an arrangement between the University of Tennessee and the Memphis General Hospital, the University of Tennessee School of Nursing was created in 1926. The school became an autonomous unit within the University in 1949, and the following year the program leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science in Nursing was inaugurated. In 1961 the name was changed to College of Nursing.

The curriculum, which combines liberal arts with nursing education on the baccalaureate level, enables the student to make an optimum contribution to the total health program. Graduates are prepared to assume professional responsibility for promotion of health and prevention of disease, and for nursing diagnosis, therapy, and rehabilitation. They are provided a foundation to go on for Master's and Doctoral study in nursing.

## *School of Basic Medical Sciences*

The School of Biological Sciences was established in 1928 with Dr. T. P. Nash, Jr., as dean. The School was organized to coordinate the teaching of the basic sciences of the health services, and to offer graduate instruction leading to the Master of Science and Doctor of Philosophy degrees in the basic biological sciences. In 1960, graduate study was organized under an associate dean and a Graduate Medical Sciences Council. The School then became known as the School of Basic Medical Sciences. This School has the responsibility of providing the foundation for the students in the Medical Units whatever their major professional goal. It is also responsible for the instructional programs of the people in the para medical fields of medical technology, cyto-technology, clinical microbiology, histological technique, and physicians' office assistant.

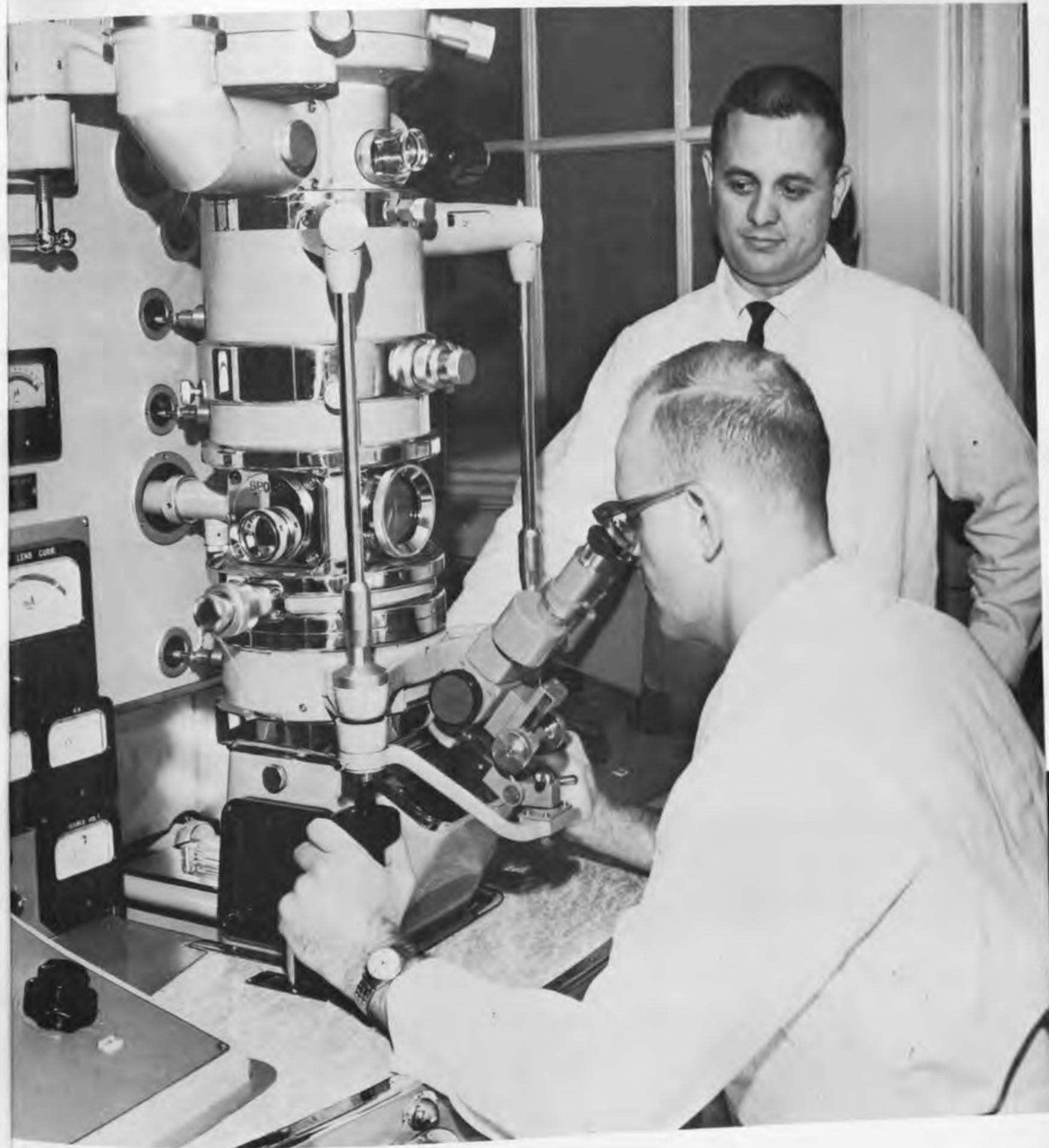




## *Graduate School— Medical Sciences*

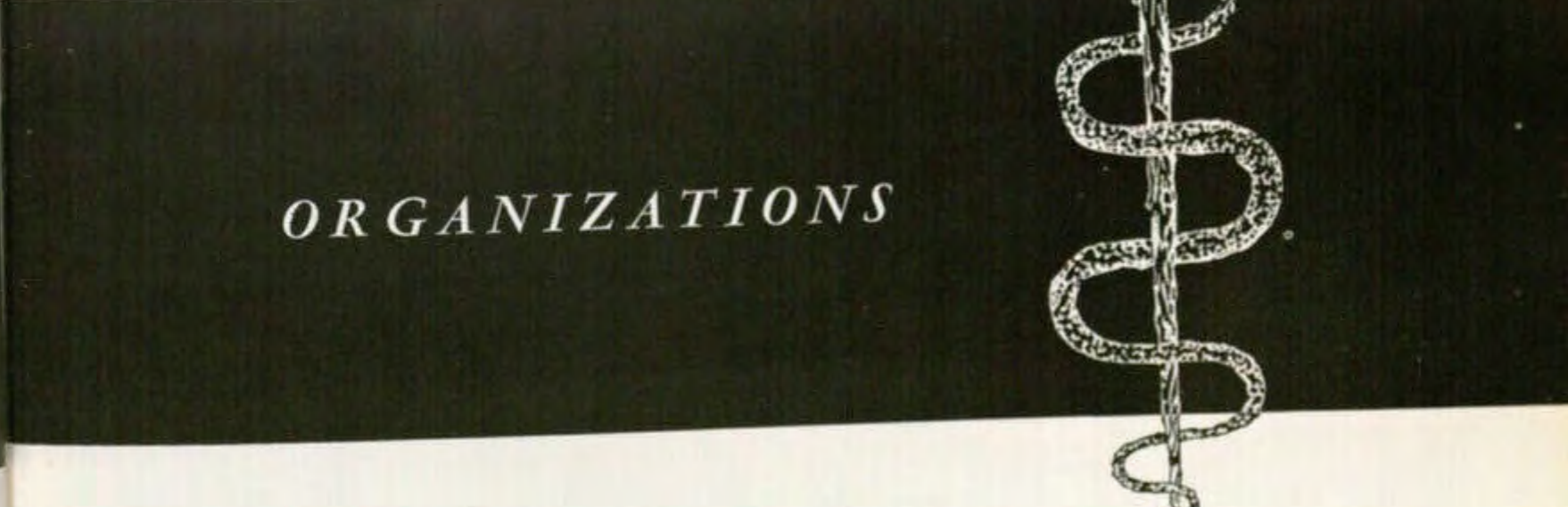

Omicron Kappa Upsilon is a society of dentists whose purpose is as stated in the preamble of the society's first constitution: "To encourage and develop a spirit of those who shall distinguish themselves by high grade of scholarship." The society was organized in 1914 at Northwestern University Dental School. The official insignia adopted in 1915 embodies the spirit of the society. The insignia is a key with the letters, O (Omicron), K (Kappa), and U (Upsilon) by the Greek letter S (Sigma). The first three initials, which indicate the name of this society, are derived from three Greek words, Odontos (teeth), Kai (and), and Hygia (Health). The encircling letter S (Sigma) derives from the Greek word Soteria (conservation or preservation), and represents the all-embracing ideal of conservation which is the chief concern of the dental profession and its oral health service. There are 46 chapters with approximately 9,500 members. Psi Chapter was founded May 15, 1929, and now has a membership of 114. Its charter members were R. S. Vinsant, R. D. Dean, C. P. Harris, J. F. Bigge, W. E. Lundy, L. J. McRae, J. J. Ogden, J. D. Towner, and W. J. Templeton.

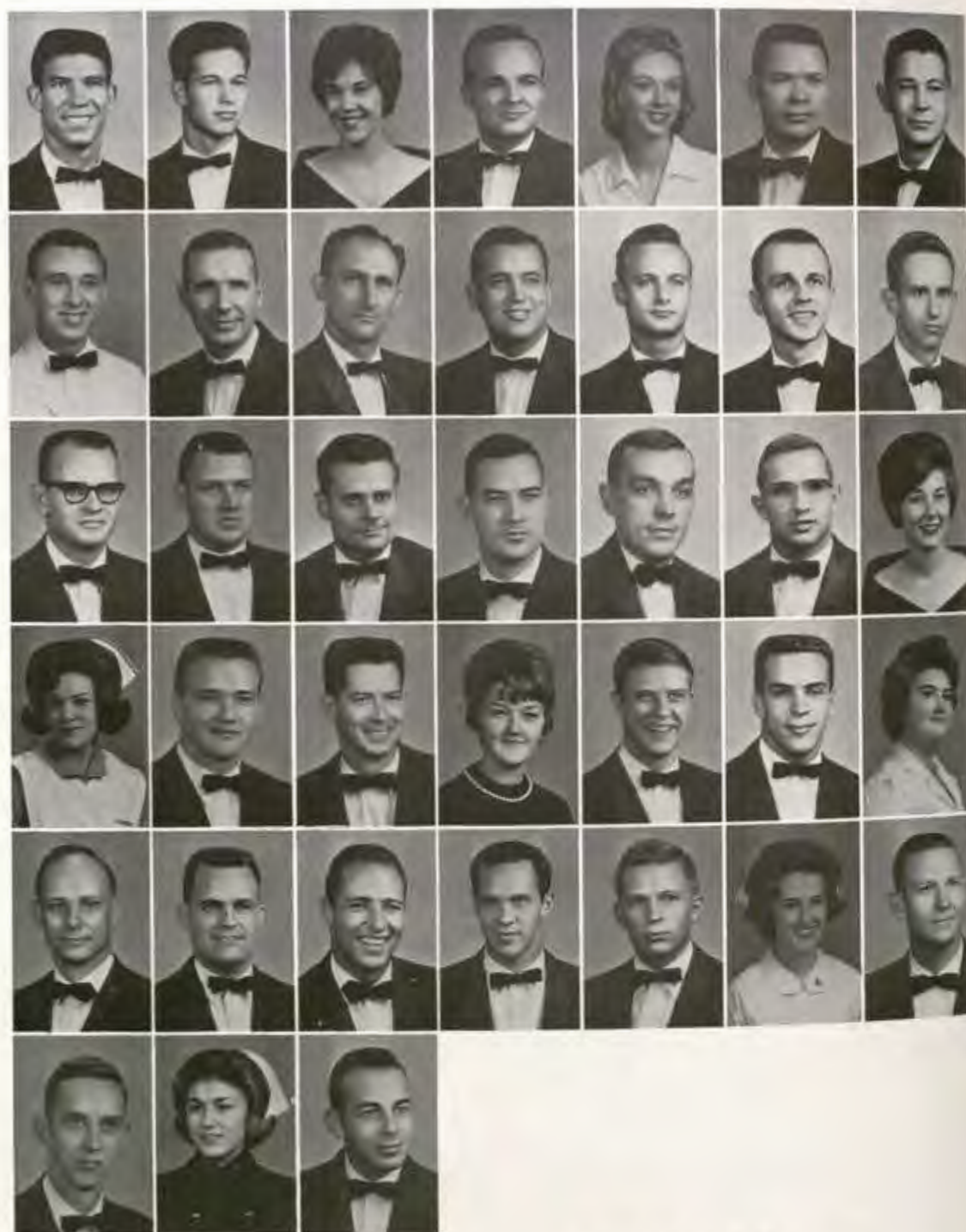

The Junior Medical Auxiliary was founded in 1939. Since that time it has grown rapidly in size and in objectives. In 1959 the organization became part of the Women's Auxiliary to the Student American Medical Association (WA-SAMA). The Memphis chapter is the largest and one of the most active in the U.S. Present membership is near 130.
