College of Medicine



The College of Medicine was founded in Nashville in 1876 as the "Medical Department of the University of Tennessee." In 1909 the Medical Department of the University of Nashville, which had been founded in 1851, joined with the University of Tennessee and they were operated jointly for two years. In 1911 the University of Nashville merged completely with the University of Tennessee.

In 1911 the board of trustees of the University of Tennessee moved all departments of the health service to Memphis. An agreement was effected with the College of Physicians and Surgeons, founded in 1906, under which the College of Physicians and Surgeons would merge with the University of Tennessee and the building at 879 Madison would be used by the University. A laboratory building was erected in 1912. These two buildings known as Lindsley and Eve Halls were named for former deans of the College of Nashville. In 1913, by agreement, the University secured the faculty, buildings, and equipment of Memphis Hospital Medical College, founded in 1878, located at 718 Union. In 1914 the Medical Department of Lincoln Memorial University, founded in Knoxville in 1889, was discontinued and merged with the University.

Phi Rho Sigma international medical fraternity was founded at Northwestern University in 1890. The College of Dentistry of the University of Tennessee was established in Nashville in 1878. In 1911 it moved to Memphis where it absorbed the University of Memphis College of Dental Surgery (founded in 1910). It is the oldest dental college in the South and the third-oldest now in operation in the nation.

The four-quarter system in operation at the University of Tennessee College of Dentistry is unique in that Tennessee has the only dental school operating under the plan of accepting and graduating a class each quarter.

The curriculum is divided into two phases, pre-clinical and clinical work. In the beginning years, the student studies basic medical sciences and courses in dental anatomy. Technique courses are added to the curriculum as the student progresses. During this period he becomes familiar with the various phases of operative dentistry, crown and bridge, and denture prosthetics.

The clinical years are spent applying the knowledge learned in the restoration of the oral cavity. The student develops a working knowledge of all phases of dentistry by working under the supervision of qualified instructors in the various fields, which include surgery, periodontics, pedodontics, diagnosis, operative dentistry, crown and bridge prosthetics, and dentistry for the chronically ill.

College of Pharmacy



The University of Tennessee College of Pharmacy was founded in 1898 as a part of the University of Tennessee Department of Chemistry in Knoxville. The School of Pharmacy, as it was then known, was moved to Nashville in 1909 and to Memphis in 1911, where it was operated as a separate school in the newly founded Medical Units.

Since then, the College of Pharmacy has become fully accredited and ranks as one of the largest Colleges of Pharmacy in the United States.

Recently, the curriculum has been revised and updated to enable the student to pursue work toward Master of Science and Doctor of Philosophy degrees in the various areas of Pharmaceutical Science. These areas include Pharmaceutics, Pharmacognosy, and Pharmaceutical and Medicinal Chemistry. Also, a program with several Memphis hospitals has greatly strengthened the instruction in Hospital Pharmacy.

The use of the latest scientific equipment, the employment of new techniques, and the instruction of highly selected and trained faculty members has enabled the graduates of the University of Tennessee College of Pharmacy to become a credit to their profession.

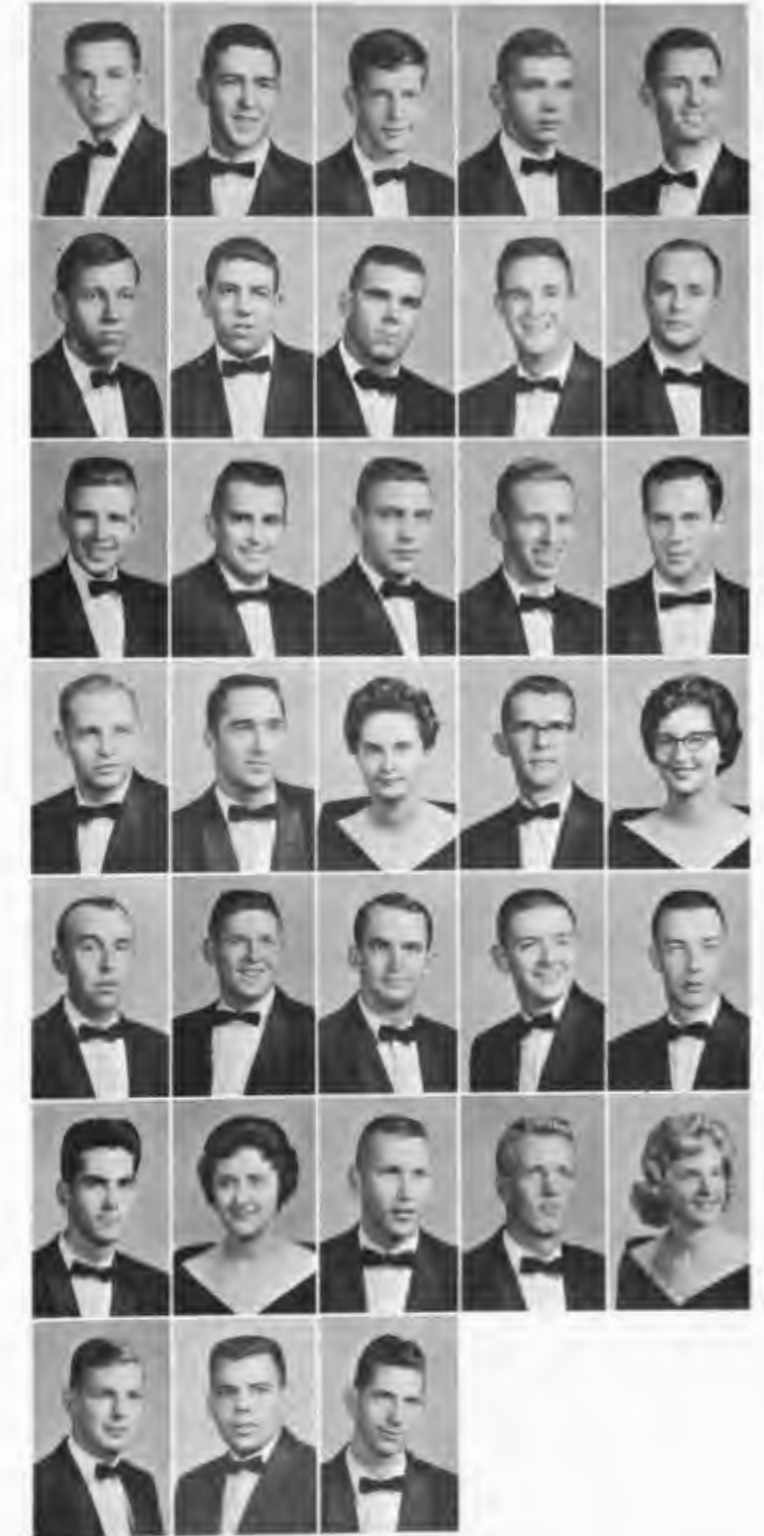

Psi chapter was organized at the University of Tennessee in Memphis in 1913, and since that time has become the largest pharmacy fraternity at the University of Tennessee.

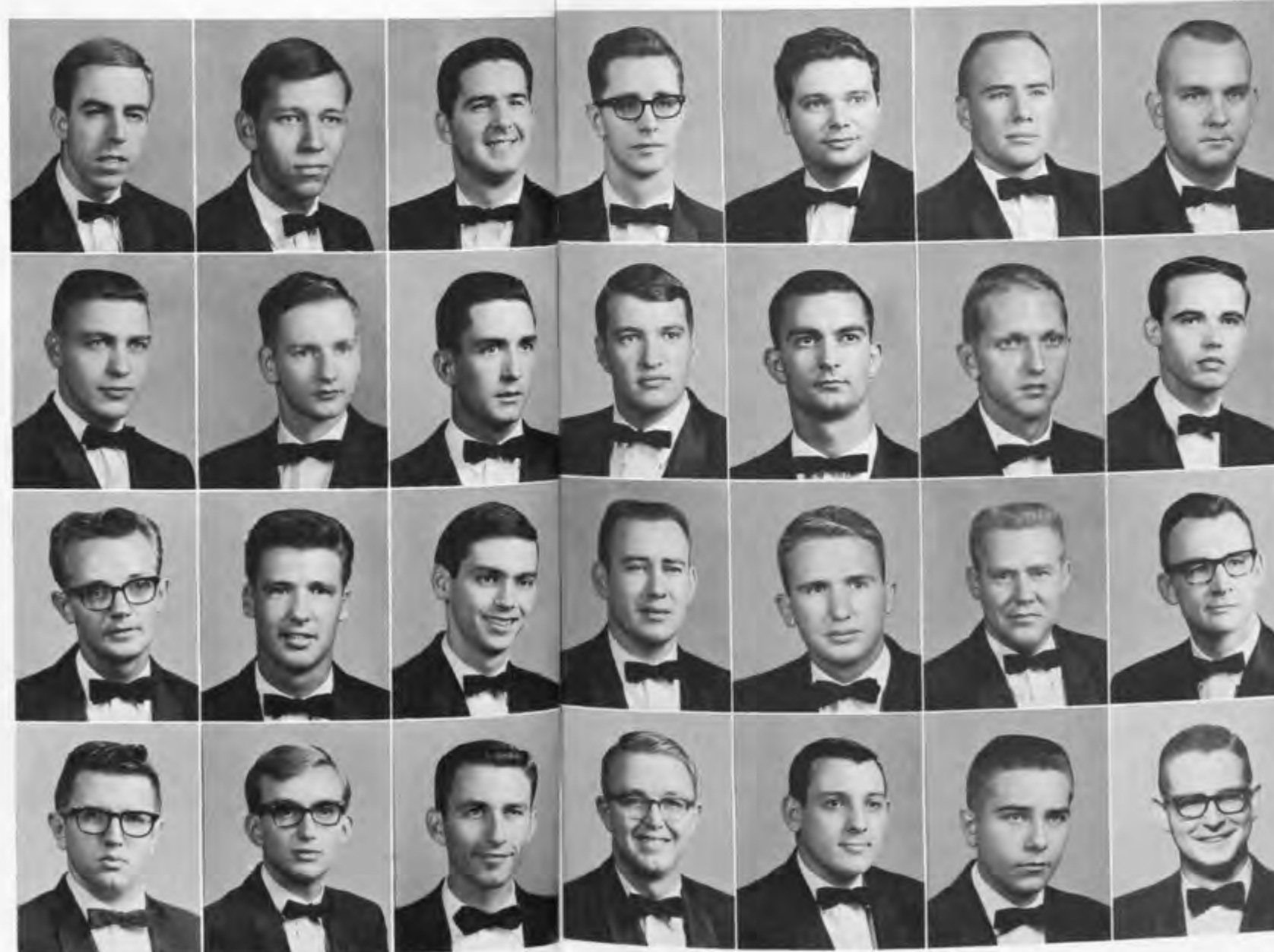

College of Nursing



In 1898 the Training School of the Memphis General Hospital was established. By an arrangement between the University of Tennessee and the Memphis General Hospital, the University of Tennessee School of Nursing was created in 1926. The school became an autonomous unit within the University in 1949, and the following year, the program leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science in Nursing was inaugurated. In 1961, the name was changed to College of Nursing. The curriculum, which combines liberal arts with nursing education on the baccalaureate level enables the student to make an optimum contribution to the total health program. Graduates are prepared to assume professional responsibility for promotion of health and prevention of disease and for nursing diagnosis, therapy, and rehabilitation. They are providing a foundation to go on for masters and doctoral study in nursing.

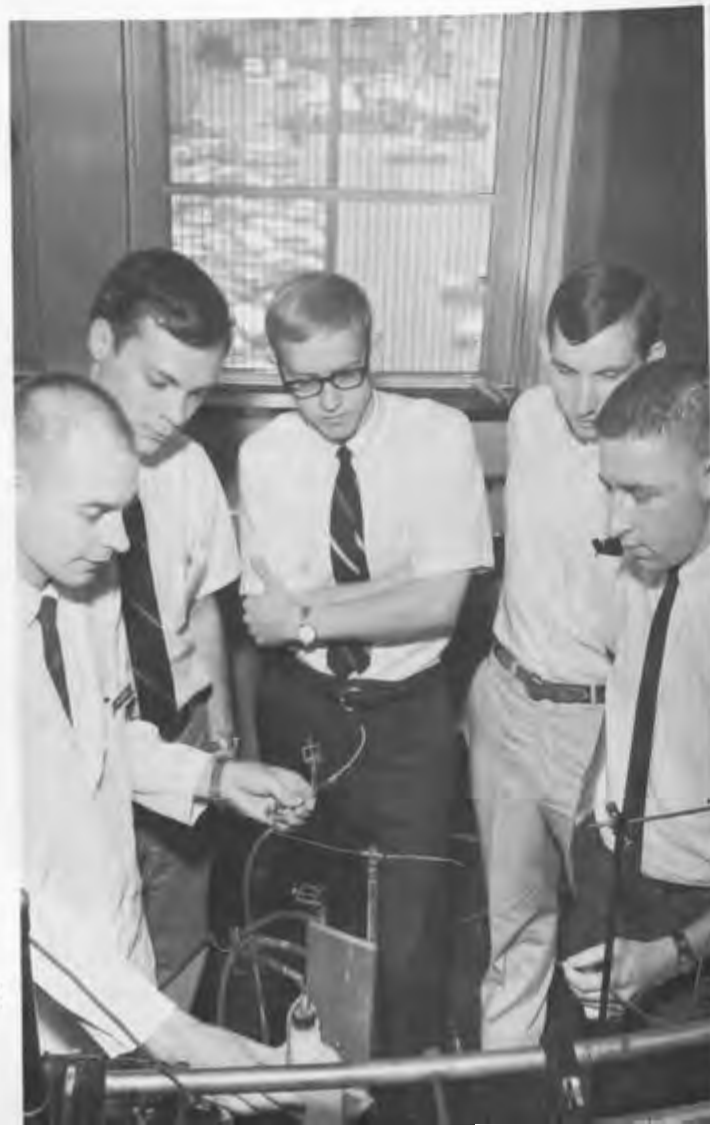

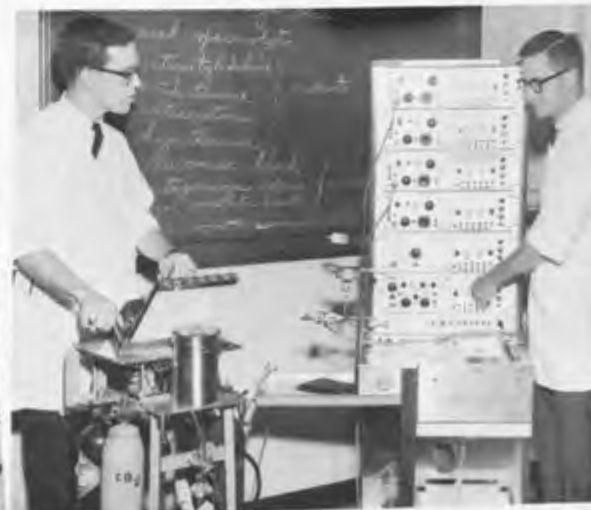

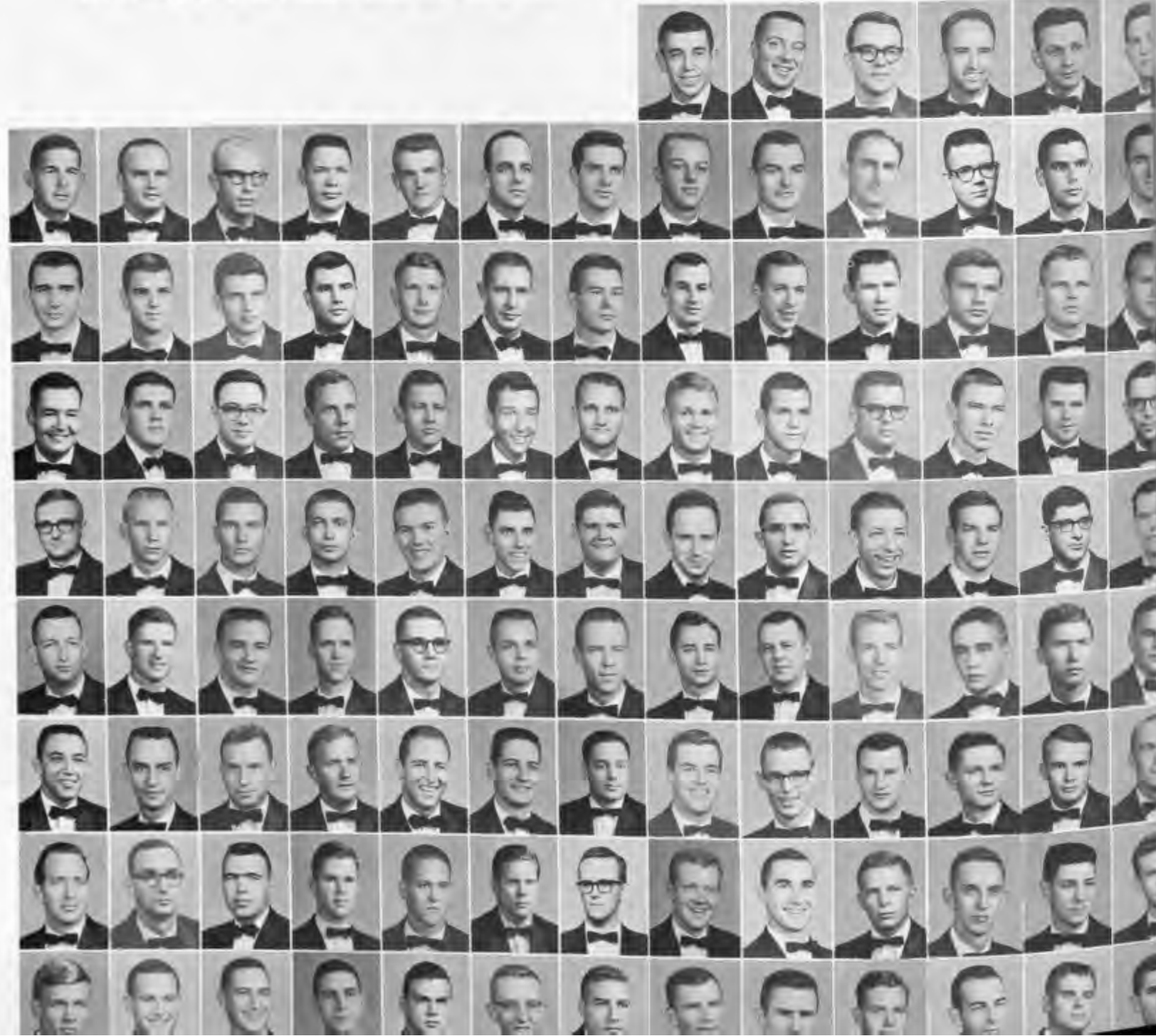
