About a career in dental hygiene

Dental hygienists are highly-skilled, licensed professionals who serve as vital members of the dental health care team. They work with dentists to provide treatment for patients.

- · perform oral screenings and examinations
- chart the condition of teeth and oral structures
- develop individualized oral hygiene programs for plaque control
- remove calculus and plaque that has collected above and below the gum line
- apply cavity-preventative agents, such as fluoride and dental sealants
- · administer local anesthetics

Statistics show that a career in dental hygiene is highly rewarding. Employment in this field is expected to grow by 19 percent between 2014 and 2024, according to the U. W. Bureau of Labor Statistics. According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics website*, the median pay for dental hygienists in 2016 is \$72,910 per year.

The UTHSC College of Dentistry was founded in 1878, making it the oldest dental college in the South, and the third-oldest public college of dentistry in the United States.



UTHSC College of Dentistry Bachelor of Science in Dental Hygiene

The UTHSC Dental Hygiene program, a part of the College of Dentistry, is the only bachelor of science degree program in West Tennessee. The program was established in 1926, and is among the oldest in the nation. It offers unparalleled clinical experiences on campus and in health care facilities throughout the city and surrounding areas, including an urban outreach program that provides care to underserved children.



As a part of their training, our dental hygiene students provide regular, ongoing preventative maintenance care to a patient base of over 2,700. They see patients who are receiving dental care in the College of Dentistry clinics located in Memphis, Union City and Bristol Tennessee. Our students also have scheduled clinical rotations in the college's dental specialty clinics.



Curriculum

The course of study is designed as the third and fourth years of a bachelor of science degree program. It consists of two academic years of full-time instruction. Upon the successful completion of the program, graduates are eligible to take national, regional and state licensing examinations.



How to apply

Prior to enrollment in the UTHSC Dental Hygiene program, students must complete the 60 semester hours of pre-professional college coursework listed. A grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 is the minimum required for application to the program. A GPA of 3.0 or higher in prerequisite courses is considered competitive for admission.

A final transcript verifying course completion must be received prior to entry into the program. Courses with grades of "D" are not acceptable. If a required course is repeated, both grades are used in calculating a cumulative GPA.

All applicants must submit:

- A completed online application accompanied with the application fee
- An admissions essay
- His or her official transcripts
- A projected plan for the completion of prerequisite course work no later than July 1 of entering year.
- Two pre-professional evaluations from advisors
