

R. D. DEAN ODONTOLOGICAL SOCIETY

The R. D. Dean Odontological Society was founded at the University of Tennessee on December 6, 1948. It is an honorary society for undergraduate students in the College of Dentistry. 



ATHLETICS

Xi Psi Phi, by winning the tennis singles and doubles tournament, jumped into an early lead that they maintained throughout the year and finished up replacing five-year winner Phi Chi as the grand champion of intramural athletics. The Xi Psi Phi's, in addition to the tennis events, won championships in golf and volleyball, and took runner-up honors in horseshoes, pool, ping pong singles, and snooker doubles. Phi Chi took the grand championship runner-up honors by winning first place in swimming, pool, ping pong singles, handball singles and doubles, and basketball, while capturing second place in golf and snooker singles.


