CRITERIA

for

THE JOHN W. RUNYAN, JR. COMMUNITY NURSING AWARD

- 1. The Award will be presented to a currently practicing nurse in Tennessee, Arkansas, or Mississippi who has made significant contributions to the development and promotion of community health nursing. This area of practice encompasses the delivery of health care services, preventive and promotive care, new forms of health education and administration, analysis of environmental factors affecting the health of populations, and the study of health maintenance. The setting for community health nursing is principally primary care settings where clients live, learn, work, play, and worship. It can also include all community-based health programs. The John W. Runyan, Jr. Community Nursing Award Advisory Committee will act as the Selection Committee.
- 2. The Selection Committee shall consider services performed by the nominee for remuneration and services performed beyond the scope of job responsibilities.
- 3. The Selection Committee shall place emphasis on the nominee's community visibility.
- 4. The Selection Committee shall not consider age, sex, or race of the nominee in its deliberations.
- 5. The Selection Committee shall consider activities within the last five years.
- 6. The baccalaureate degree in nursing will be the **minimum standard** of professional education preparation.
- 7. It is anticipated that the Award will be presented annually; however, in order to maintain the stature and integrity of the Award, if no appropriate nominee is available in any year, there will be no presentation.
- 8. In exceptional situations, the Selection Committee may choose to waive one or more of the above criteria.

The award, established in 1979, recognizes a currently practicing nurse in Tennessee, Arkansas, or Mississippi who has made significant contributions to the development and promotion of community health nursing. The setting for community health nursing is principally primary care settings where clients live, learn, work, play, and worship.

The award is named in honor of Dr. John W. Runyan, Jr., University Distinguished Professor Emeritus in the University of Tennessee Health Science Center's Department of Preventive Medicine. Dr. Runyan was an internationally recognized advocate for the role of nurses in community health care.
