LinkedUp: Connecting Teens to Birth Control Before College K. Fouquier (PI) 2017-2019

Teen First Mississippi is partnering with the Lanier High Teen Wellness Clinic to develop, implement and evaluate the LinkedUp program which aims to establish reliable and consistent systems for linking older teens (ages 17-19) to youth-friendly sexual and reproductive health services as they transition from high school to college and into the adult health care system. \$10,000/yr. = \$20,000 (funded)

Lanier High Teen Advocacy Program (LH-TAP)

The LH-TAP is a collaborative project with the UMC SON's Teen Wellness Clinic initiatives. Students from Lanier High School will be recruited to serve on the LH-TAP's advisory committee and will participate in the planning, implementation, and evaluation of a multidimensional peer-educator program that incorporates a lifespan perspective and provides an evidence-based curriculum designed to build communication skills, delay the initiation of sexual intercourse, and promote condom use among sexually active participants. \$50,000 (funded)
