


Instructions for Logging onto New MedU Site

1. Go to the MedU website: <https://www.med-u.org>. Click on “Sign In” at the top.

A Student who received an email directing you to log-in to your course on MedU's **new** learning management system.

An Educator at an institution that is already using MedU's **new** learning management system (released June 1, 2017).

Anyone who purchased an individual subscription using a credit card after June 1, 2017.

5. Enter your email then click "Send me instructions to set my password"



6. You will get an email like the one below from MedU with a link you can click on to “Access Account”. From there, it will take you back to the MedU site where you can create your password.



7. Once you are in the system, then you will see a similar dashboard, click on “Pediatrics Clerkship” for the custom course with only the required cases. Or, to view all possible CLIPP cases, click on “CLIPP”.

Computer-Assisted Learning in Pediatrics Program. CLIPP's 32 interactive pediatric virtual patient cases deliver on the learning objectives of the Council on Medical Student Education in Pediatrics (COMSEP) clerkship curriculum. CLIPP is a collaboration between MedU and COMSEP.

HVC: High Value Care

Available free of charge. High Value Care's 12 cross-disciplinary virtual patient cases explore the fundamentals of providing value in health care and are adopted from the American College of Physicians' (ACP) and the Alliance for Academic Internal Medicine's (AAIM) High Value Care Resident curriculum. High Value Care is a collaboration between MedU, the ACP, and AAIM.

DX: Diagnostic Excellence

Available free of charge for the 2017-2018 subscription year. These 6 virtual patient cases contain foundational content about diagnosis, including the factors that contribute to diagnostic error and the strategies that can be used to avoid error. Diagnostic Excellence introduces students to the cognitive processes and system-related issues that can lead to errors. DX is a collaboration between MedU and the Society to Improve Diagnosis in Medicine (SIDM). The development of the course was funded through grants from AAIM and The Doctors Company Foundation.

Culture in Health

Available free of charge. The three cases that make up the Culture in Health Care Course are designed to teach fundamental cross-cultural skills that can be used in the provision of health care services. The goal is to provide culturally appropriate care that maximizes common ground between the differing perspectives of the patient and the provider.
